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Definition of Positive Behavior Support

- Positive behavior support is the integration of
 - Valued outcomes
 - Behavioral and biomedical science
 - Validated procedures
 - Systems change

In order to enhance quality of life and prevent problem behavior

Note: PBS plans require our teams and those supporting adults to change their behavior

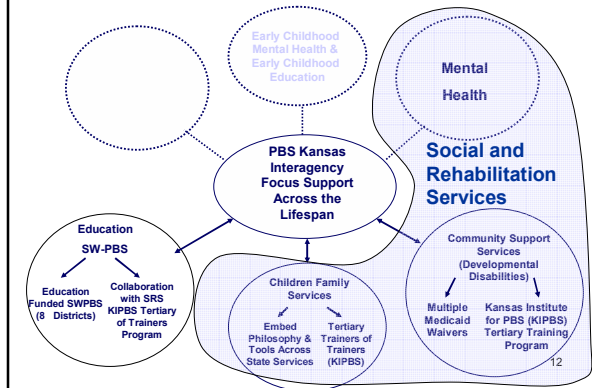

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Summary of PBS-Kansas Action Planning

5 Major Goals:

- 1) Provide guidance and documentation that will assist individuals across diverse life span agencies in learning about positive behavior support (PBS) and self assess level of fidelity and implementation status
- 2) Continue to obtain funding to maintain PBS Kansas and continue a fiscal operating budget
- 3) Provide opportunities for collaborative planning among administrators across and within agencies and services

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Summary of PBS-Kansas Action Planning

5 Major Goals (continued):

- 4) Establish a plan for building greater public awareness and buy-in for PBS within the state and regional state services
- 5) Maintain quarterly reporting plan for data related to PBS Kansas Evaluation. The evaluation plan will include outcomes representing:
 - statewide accomplishments
 - systems outcomes
 - staff training outcomes
 - public testimony

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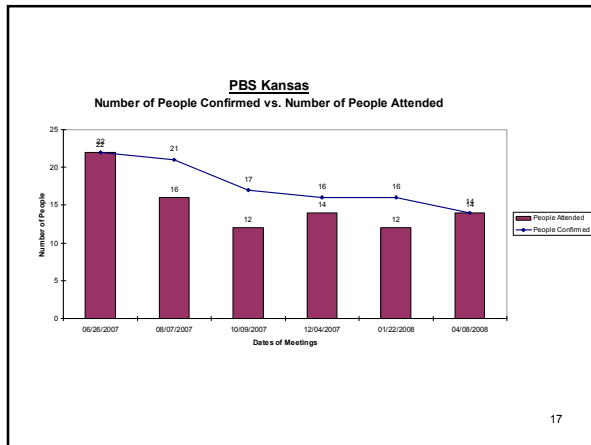

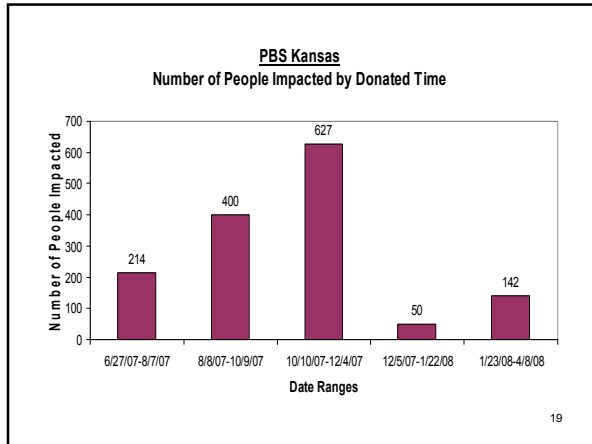
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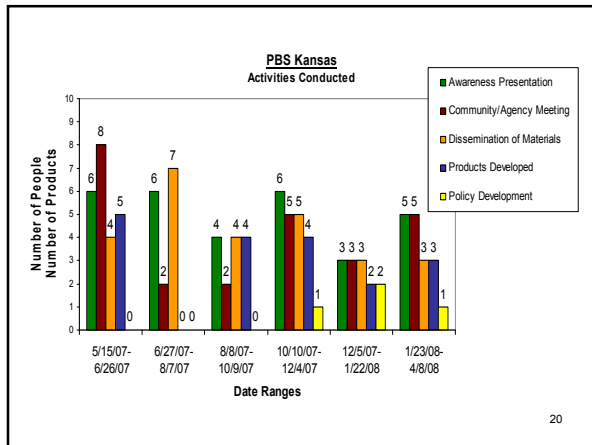


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How Far We're Going for PBS

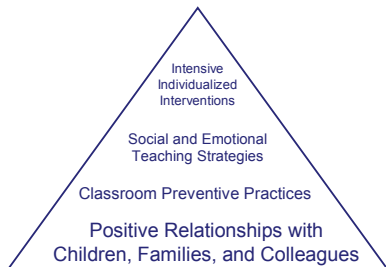

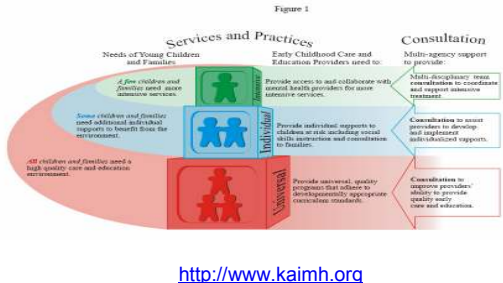
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The Teaching Pyramid Fox, Dunlap, Hemmeter, Joseph, & Strain (2003)

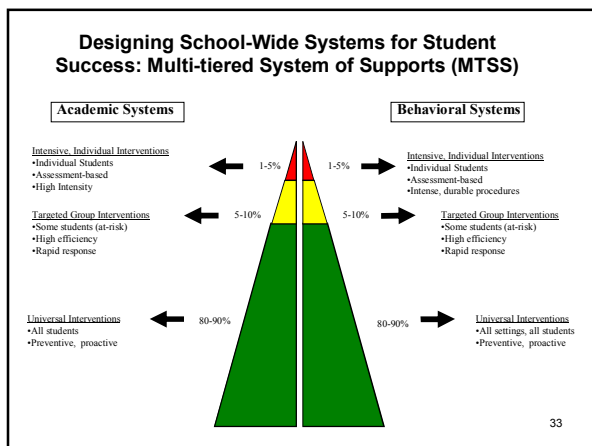
State Funding for Positive Behavior Support from the Department of Education

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Kansas Department of Education SW-PBS Implementation Plan

Goals:

1. Expand available resources and tools to ensure evidence-based interventions are accessible and used statewide.
2. Build a statewide integrated system to support SW-PBS as a component of a larger MTSS plan.
3. Expand interagency system of care practices.
4. Refine an integrated data capacity/management system that decreases duplication and ensures usability of data for decisions.
